Software/Calculator: A calculator with basic statistics functionality is recommended for this course. We will be using the StatCrunch software that comes with MyLab for computations and graphing. I will show you how to use this software.

GRADE DETERMINATION:

There will be a MyLab homework and StatCrunch lab score (30%), six unit quizzes (40%), a project score (10%), and a comprehensive final exam (20%).

HOMEWORK AND STATCRUNCH LAB POLICY:

Homeworks is due weekly by midnight on Sundays. You have unlimited tries on the homeworks.

MyLab is the online homework system that comes with our textbook. Homework will be submitted weekly in MyLab and will count 10 points each. Late homework will not be accepted since lowest 10 point homework score will be dropped and the remaining scores will be averaged on a 100 point scale.

The Assigned Problems page are the corresponding problems from the text. MyLab will generate variations of these problems.

There will be three Labs using StatCrunch. These labs are designed to help you get familiar with using StatCrunch so that you can use it for the project. These will count as 10 pt homework assignments.

PROJECT:

The final project paper is due in Canvas by midnight on Friday, August 2. See the **Project Guidelines** document in Canvas for more information.

QUIZ AND FINAL EXAM POLICY:

There is a weekly online quiz on Tuesdays in MyLab. These are 60 minute open-book mini-exams covering the previous week's material. The quizzes close at midnight on Tuesdays. You can start the quiz anytime on Tuesday. No breaks are allowed and there is no access to the Learning Aids (Videos, Show me How to Solve this,...). You must complete the quiz in one sitting in the allotted time before midnight.

The quizzes are timed. No breaks are allowed. Once you start the quiz you must finish it within the time allotted. It is your responsibility to have uninterrupted internet access during this time.

Missed quizzes: No make-up quizzes will be given. The final exam score may be substituted for one missing quiz. (If no quiz scores are missing, the final exam score may be used to replace the lowest quiz score). The final exam, however, is NOT optional and may not be missed.

The Final Exam will have the same online format as the quizzes. The final will available online Wed, July 31 and Thurs, August 1 in two parts, each part is 60 minutes long.
